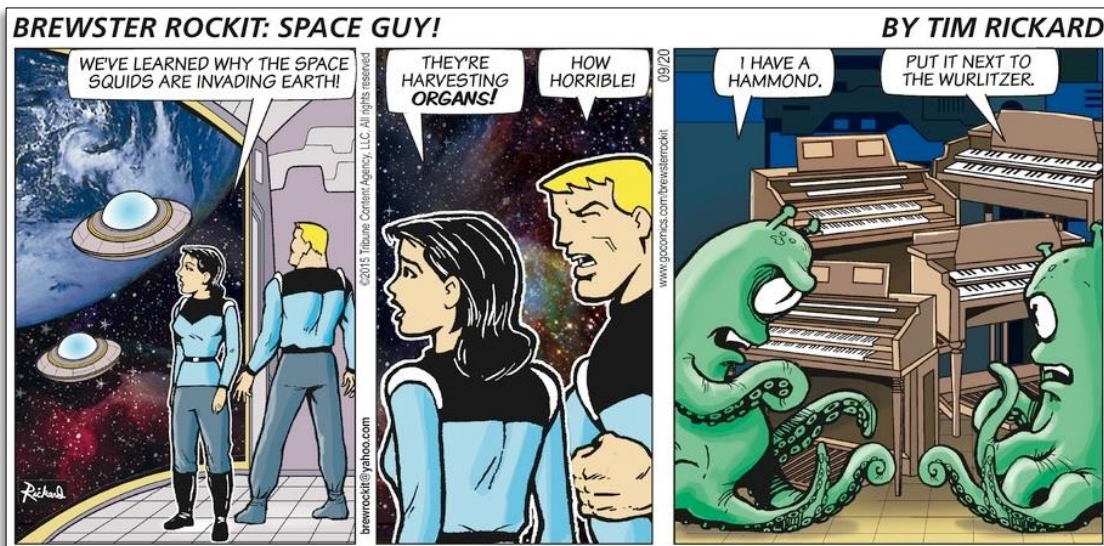

Trudy Faber Flentrop Organ Recital
With Readings by Arthur Faber
First Presbyterian Church, 15 Chillicothe St. South Charleston, Ohio



Dayton Chapter Member, Trudy Faber, will hold an organ recital on October 4th at 4:00 PM, at the First Presbyterian Church, in South Charleston. The church has an amazing Flentrop organ from The Netherlands. It is a smaller tracker organ with a flat pedalboard, but is from the same builder as the grand Flentrop at Harvard.

Trudy will perform a variety of pieces, including J. S. Bach, of course, Sweelinck, Fanny Mendelssohn, Elizabeth Stirling, Gordon Young, and a soft Voluntary by Thomas Loud. As Trudy performs a lovely setting of Psalm 121 by H. W. Zimmermann, Dr. Arthur Faber will read the psalm in German. Especially delightful is "The Fiddlers," the 6th piece in a "Sweet for Mother Goose" by George Ackerley. Dr. Faber will also read the somewhat altered rhyme of "Old King Cole" that has been set to this music.



Finally, "God of Grace and God of Glory" by Paul Manz will provide lively pedal work, and the recital will end with "O Filii et Filiae" by Lynnwood Farnam.

The church is in the middle of South Charleston at 15 Chillicothe St. near the intersection of US 35 and 41.
